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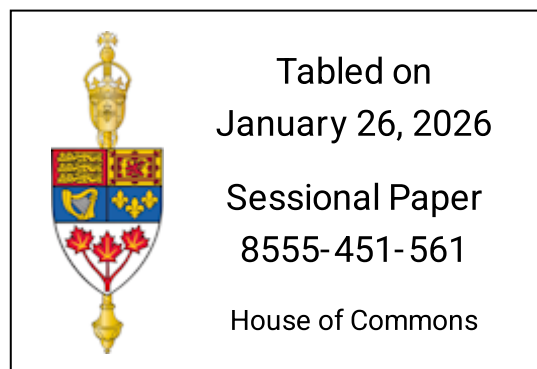

Public Safety Canada retains statistics on past Access to Information requests using the categories established in the department's Annual Reports on the Administration of the *Access to Information Act*. Information is captured for each fiscal year showing the number of extensions taken for closed requests according to their length and the reason for the extension. The length of extensions is broken down across the following time periods: 30 days or less, 31 to 60 days, 61 to 120 days, 121 to 180 days, 181 to 365 days, and 365 days or more.

For the period of April 1, 2020, to November 13, 2025, the department closed a total of 2481 formal Access to Information requests. During this period, Public Safety Canada captured the following information for extensions on requests closed during this period:

- Extensions of 31 to 60 days: 361
- Extensions of 61 to 120 days: 261
- Extensions of 121 to 180 days: 118
- Extensions of 181 to 365 days: 55
- Extensions of 365 days or more: 12

(b) what is the longest extension for requests currently being processed?

The longest extension for requests currently being processed at Public Safety Canada is 2,295 days. Typically, the longest extensions granted within the department range from 250 to 550 days. The reasons for such extensions are twofold: 1) the time required to retrieve, process, and analyze the volume of documentation generated by the request; and 2) delays in receiving responses from other government departments that Public Safety Canada is required to

consult. The extension was required due to the large size of the file (over 30,000 pages), a large volume of classified material as well as the requirement to consult with 14 federal organizations. The requester of this file also submitted other requests around the same time, including one over 75,000 pages and several over 30,000 pages. The department has sought to balance working on files from this requester while ensuring that files from other requesters are also prioritized. The department has since completed most of the requests that were received from this requester during this time. In the case of the file mentioned above, the department will continue to work on the file until it is completed.

Note about data accuracy: On February 8, 2024, information stored on Canada Border Services Agency servers became inaccessible during infrastructure maintenance performed by Shared Services Canada. Subsequently, a significant portion (2021-2024) of Canada Border Services Agency access to information and privacy case management data was lost. As such, the Canada Border Services Agency cannot attest to the accuracy of some of the statistics provided. - In accordance with paragraph 9(1)(a), 960 days were taken for the purposes of reviewing a high volume of records where meeting the original time limit would unreasonably interfere with the operations of the government institution. The request contains approximately 65,000 pages.
- In accordance with paragraph 9(1)(b), 120 days were taken for the purposes of consulting with other federal organizations.

## Canada School of Public Service

### a) How many requests required extensions in excess of (i) 30 days, (ii) 90 days, (iii) 180 days, (iv) one year, (v) two years?

The Canada School of Public Service is transitioning to a new case management system supporting the administration of Access to Information Act and Privacy Act requests. As part of this process, legacy data in the current system was purged, and only records from January 1, 2021 onward were retained.

For the period of January 1, 2020 to December 31, 2020, information regarding requests received that required extensions is available in the Canada School of Public Service's Annual Reports on the Administration of the Access to Information Act, which are publicly available on its [website](#).

For the period of January 1, 2021 to November 13, 2025, the Canada School of Public Service received a total of 130 access to information requests. Of those 130 requests the Canada School of Public Service sought extensions in excess of

- I. 30 days: 16 requests
- II. 90 days: 8 requests
- III. 180 days: 1 request
- IV. one year: 0 requests
- V. two years: 0 requests

### b) What is the longest extension for requests currently being processed, broken down by each department, agency, Crown corporation or other government entity?

The longest extension in effect for requests currently being processed by the Canada School of Public Service is 90 days. This extension was determined based on the following provisions of the Access to Information Act:

- In accordance with paragraph 9(1)(a), a 60 day extension was taken for the purposes of reviewing a large number of records and meeting the original time limit would unreasonably interfere with the operations of the institution.
- In accordance with paragraph 9(1)(b), a 30 day extension was taken for the purpose of consulting with another federal government institution.
- In accordance with paragraph 9(2), as the extension taken under subsection (1) was for more than 30 days, notice of the extension was given to the Information Commissioner of Canada at the same time as the requester.

## Public Sector Pension Investment Board

As a non-agent crown corporation, the Public Sector Pension Investment Board upholds an autonomous, arm's length operating mandate. The Public Sector Pension Investment Board is subject to disclosure requirements as set out in the Public Sector Pension Investment Board Act and the Access to Information Act and reports to the President of the Treasury Board. Information concerning the activities of the Public Sector Pension Investment Board is presented in the Annual Report tabled in Parliament by the President of the Treasury Board.
